Please read the guidelines carefully **before** you complete the application form and submit your manuscript.

BACKGROUND

The Academic and Non-Fiction Authors Association of South Africa (ANFASA) in Collaboration with the Department of Sport, Arts and Culture (DSAC) announces its inaugural DSAC Publishing Hub. This is an industry stimulus project to support authors and revitalise the publishing industry. Also, to encourage the creation of new literature telling our own stories and preserving our heritage.

It is essential for the Department of Sport, Arts and Culture to provide support for authors and the publishing industry to foster a dynamic literary community and sustain the creation of a wide range of significant literature including that written in the previously marginalised official languages. The Department does this through the Books & Publishing directorate, which is dedicated to supporting, developing and promoting the Literary Arts sector through an interactive programme that involves and benefits the sector. The Directorate developed a number of programmes directed at serving the sector holistically, responding to the three major cornerstones, which are Reading, Writing and Publishing. DSAC Publishing Hub is one of these programmes.

The DSAC Publishing Hub will make an impact on the cultural and economic development of the creative sector by encouraging creation of new works, building a market for books, and encouraging the culture of reading.

The overall impact of the programme on the creative economy will be:

- Raising the profile of South African literature
- Stimulating economic development
- Position the publishing sector as a valuable contributor to economic growth and job creation.
- Promote sustainability.
- Stimulate intellectual capital.

1. ABOUT ANFASA

ANFASA was formed as a national association especially for authors of general non-fiction works, textbooks and academic works, but it does not exclude authors of fictional works from membership. Many non-fiction authors write fiction as well, and vice versa. Moreover, ANFASA's programmes, and its objectives, apply broadly to all authors. ANFASA is dedicated to defending their intellectual property rights, promoting their works, and sharing information, and offering advice and expertise on writing and publishing.

ANFASA's vision is to be a member-driven association aiming to uphold and enhance the profile and status of authors in South Africa, through advocating for the recognition of their works and protection of their rights, in collaboration and cooperation with other stakeholders in the book value chain such as publishers, booksellers and libraries.

ANFASA recognises that authors have the potential to influence society for the better, as expressed in the United Nations development goals of campaigning to end poverty, protecting the environment and promote peace and prosperity. Authors played a significant role in the South African struggle for democracy and showed that authors can have power. 3. CRITERIA

A yearly assessment of the selection procedure is required to make sure it remains relevant and takes into account current circumstances and or conditions. Emphasis will be placed on established and emerging authors with exceptional manuscripts.

The selection panel to ensure that the final recommended list of manuscript in any one year is fair and balanced in terms of language, gender and geographic location, and that their ethnicity is, as far as possible, broadly representative of the population demographics of the country.

The following focus areas will be considered:

- New and original works
- Manuscripts of national interest
- Manuscript with a strong South African theme or topic, not largely explored so far
- Manuscripts that have a high selling potential

4. RULES FOR SUBMISSION

- The Manuscript must be unpublished and not translated into or from other languages.
- The Manuscript must be an original idea and the author must have full copyright.
- The applicant is allowed to submit ONLY one manuscript for this Call.
- Current recipients of funding from DSAC or AGSA(ANFASA Grant Scheme for Authors) are not eligible for manuscript submission.
- Only South African citizen are eligible to make submissions.
- Women, youth, and people with disabilities are encouraged to submit.

The selection panel will consider manuscripts written in any of the official South African Languages including Khoisan language and will consider submissions in the following categories:

- Novel
- Poetry Anthologies
- Short Story Anthologies
- Drama and Theatre scripts
- Narrative non-fiction (politics, current affairs, history, military history, sport, true crime, biographies/autobiographies, health and well-being, humour, business, and personal finance)
- Children and Young Adults' books

Please note that we will not consider the following submissions:

- Television and Film Scripts
- Novelette and Novellas
- Self Help or motivational scripts

5. SUBMISSION FORMATS

- You will be asked to upload your manuscript, identity document, Tax certificate/document and curriculum vitae once you have finalised your application form.
- Please note we will **NOT** accept manuscripts sent via email, fax or post and hand delivered.
- Manuscripts must be typed. We do not accept handwritten submissions.
- Manuscripts must be sent in Microsoft Word format only. Files saved in WordPad, PDF or links will not be accepted.
- Manuscripts must be between 80 000 words and no more than 120 000 words. Exceptions will be made for Children's books and poetry anthologies.
- - Font type: Arial; Font size: 12
 - Page: A 4 size
 - Paragraphs 1.5 line spacing

- Manuscripts file must be saved by author name and surname followed by manuscript title e.g., **Samukelisiwe Mfuphi – Kwasekuqaleni**
- Please make sure that manuscripts do not have printing functionality disabled.
- If watermarks are included, please ensure that the text behind the watermark is readable.

The following will lead to **automatic disqualification**:

- Provision of dishonest and inaccurate information.
- Incomplete submission of Application Form.
- Submission of manuscripts that do not adhere to the format and length guidelines established.
- Incomplete Manuscripts.
- Failure to disclose any conflicts of interest.
- Late submission of any and all documentation.
- Applications submitted by government employees.
- Applications received from non-South African citizens.
- Project that falls outside the domains and genre/ disciplines stipulated above under Section 5.

7. Post Manuscript Selection Process

Once the selection process has been completed the following takes place:

- The applicant shall be informed of the outcome.
- In case of unsuccessful results, applicants will be provided with the reason thereof.
- The decision of the outcome by the selection panel is final, there will be **NO** appeals.
- The shortlisted manuscripts will advance to developmental editing,
- Thereafter, they will be submitted to the publisher to proceed with the book production and publishing process.

PLEASE NOTE:

- ANFASA and the Department of Sports Arts and Culture **does not sell** application forms, guidelines and / or any other application related documentation.
- Applicants should not pay for these documents from any other person or organisation.
- Applications that do not meet the **MANDATORY** requirements will not be accepted.
- Support is dependent on availability of funds.
